Letter from the Minister

Dear Church Members,

As you know from previous updates, Murrayfield is being asked to go into a Parish Grouping with two other congregations, these being the (soon-to-be) united charge of Gorgie-Dalry-Stenhouse & Palmerston Place, and St. Stephen's Comely Bank. At present, GDS and Palmerston are working towards their union which involves agreeing a basis of union and having a congregational vote, prior to this all being brought to Presbytery.

Whilst the focus for these two congregations is necessarily on their union it was still regarded important that an initial meeting was held with ourselves and SSCB. This first



meeting happened on Sunday 4th June and was attended

by eight representatives from each of the four congregations. Our folk who participated were Catherine Campbell, Scott Kerr, Fay Forsythe, Jane Smart, David McGuffie, John Crispin, Ellenore Foulis, and myself.

The meeting was held at Slateford Longstone church and was facilitated by Rev John Young from Liberton Kirk. Also present were Stewart Weaver (convenor of the Presbytery's Deployment Group) and Rev Nelu Balaj and Helen Hannah (members of the Deployment Group). John started the meeting off by explaining the close working of Liberton Kirk with some of its neighbouring congregations over a period of the last twenty years.

Whilst the Mission Plan for Liberton is a union with team ministry it was still very interesting to hear about the benefits and principles of joint working. One thing that stood out was John Young's encouragement that a covenant be developed that could complement any eventual Basis of Parish Grouping. He advocated this as a helpful way to establish and develop good relationships alongside the more formal/legal documents and processes.

After John's introduction we split into smaller groups to look at themed areas of congregational life. These areas were: local mission, world mission, youth, pastoral care, discipleship, property/finance, worship. communication. The meeting was a very helpful first gathering of people from the existing four congregations. Lots of work will need to be done, and many steps taken, but this was a positive start with a good atmosphere.

John Young read to us a couple of short parables from Matthew's Gospel at its 13th chapter: "The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field, which a man found and reburied; then in his joy he goes and sells all that he has and buys that field. Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant in search of fine pearls; on finding one pearl of great value, he went and sold all that he had and bought it."

I think this is a fine way to conclude this letter for it reminds us of what is truly significant in life and reminds us why the work of the church is so important. In the midst of all the machinations of Presbytery Planning it is easy to lose sight of the immense value of the kingdom of God for our own lives as individuals and for the communities we serve as a parish church. May we be encouraged that we are blessed with the gift of such life transforming treasure.

Moderator pays tribute "from the heart" to longest serving female minister

The Moderator of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland has paid tribute "from the heart" to the longest serving female minister, Rev Jean Montgomerie, stating "we stand on the shoulders of giants".

On 11 January, 1973 Ms Montgomerie was one of the first women to be ordained as a minister of Word and Sacrament within the Church, and was also the first to convene a committee of the General Assembly.

"Jean also told me whilst we were having coffee that the General Assembly passed the act allowing women to be candidates for ministry on Wednesday and her application was mailed on Sunday," Mrs Foster-Fulton added.

Addressing commissioners Mrs Foster-Fulton praised Ms Montgomerie as a trailblazer, saying: "Thank you for hearing that call and saying 'I hear you' and it is for me, and being brave enough."

"Thank you from the General Assembly, thank you from both the charges that you so wonderfully led, Kelman Memorial in Peterculter and Forfar St Margaret's. Thank you for convening the board of ministry. Thank you for serving this church so beautifully, and you continue to do it. So thank you."

Reflecting on her 50 years in ministry, Ms Montgomerie said: "It's been absolutely amazing to get this far.

"I believe the church has given me a lot of support during that time. There has obviously been lots of ups and downs but by in large it's been a good journey.


"The highs have been preaching and pastoral work. Now I'm retired I still enjoy preaching, although it takes a lot out of me."

Paying tribute to Ms Montgomerie earlier this year on the anniversary of her ordination, Rev Shuna Dicks said: "It is on behalf of the women that followed in your footsteps that I add my gratitude for showing that women could and should lead in the Church of Scotland.
