



A request for volunteers to help with stewarding

The Assembly Business Committee is seeking volunteers to help with stewarding at this year's General Assembly.

In the case of an emergency, Stewards will be required to assist in the evacuation of the building by directing people to the nearest available exit.

The morning session is 08.30 to 11.30, the lunch time session is 11.30 to 14.30 and the afternoon session is 14.30 to 17.30.
